**Subject:** [External] Safety guidance for state employees

Dear Colleagues,

I am writing today to thank you for your hard work and exceptional dedication across state government. This is a challenging time for all of us, but we each play an important role in providing necessary resources to the people of North Carolina when they need them the most.

North Carolina has been consistently reporting an increase in COVID-19 positive cases and other concerning indicators. These recent concerns serve as a reminder that we all have an individual responsibility to protect those around us and reduce the spread of this virus. Consistent with the



Department of Health and Human Services recommendation to wear a face covering whenever you are in public: All state employees who are able to do so are expected to wear cloth face coverings at all times while inside your agency worksites, unless you are alone in your office or personal space.

State agencies are working to procure cloth and disposable face masks to distribute to employees. In the interim, employees are asked to use the face coverings they use on a daily basis when in public. In addition to wearing a cloth face covering, science and data show that waiting six feet apart and washing your hands frequently are the most effective steps to protect those around us by controlling viral spread.
